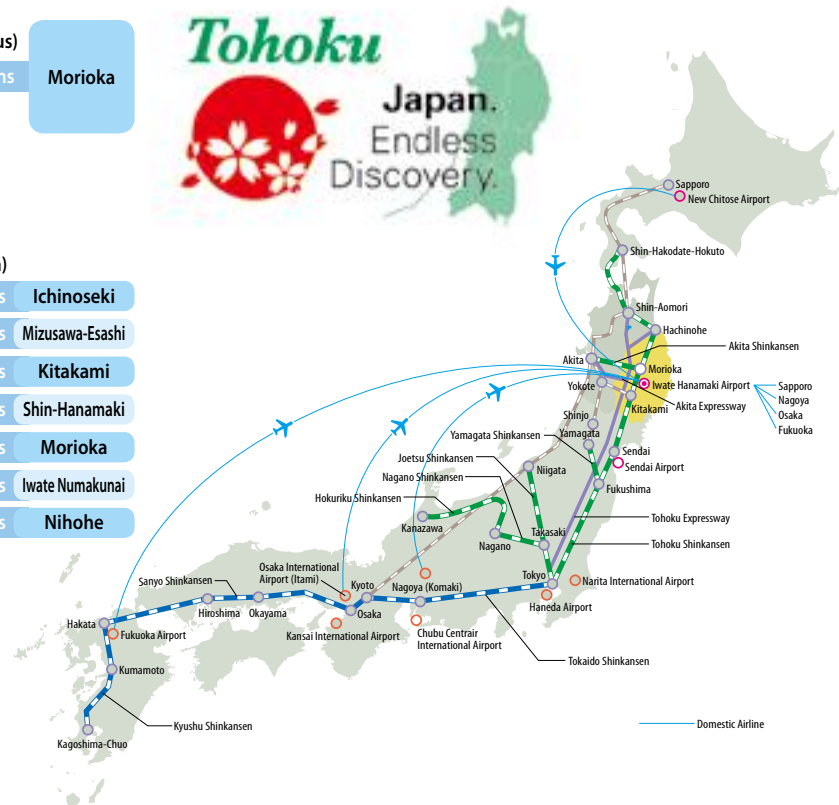

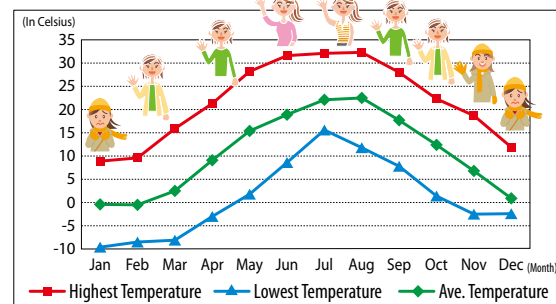

### Iwate PR characters, the "Wanko Brothers"

The motifs for these characters are "wanko soba," a symbol of hospitality in Iwate, and lacquerware, as Iwate produces more lacquer than any other prefecture in Japan. The main character is "Sobacchi," and variants with representative foods in their bowl-heads are found in each area in sightseeing spots and events introducing local foods including "Omocchi" (mochi), "Unicchi" (sea urchin over rice), and "Kokucchi" (grains).

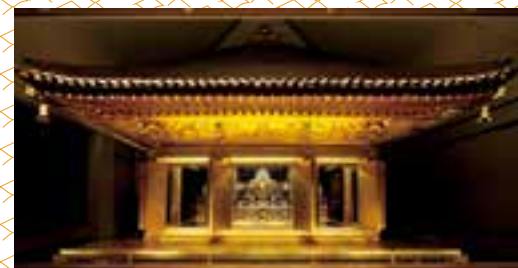

### Iwate Prefecture

Iwate, located in the northeast part of Japan, is the 2nd largest prefecture after Hokkaido. Iwate is full of charm throughout each of the four rich, beautiful seasons and boasts stunning views of the sea from the rias coastline, elegant mountains, and many historical sites telling stories of history and culture represented by two world heritage sites.



**World Heritage Site, Hiraizumi (Hiraizumi)**  
In June of 2011, "Hiraizumi- Temples, Gardens, and Archaeological Sites Representing the Buddhist Pure Land" was listed as a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Site.



**Mutsu-ji (Hiraizumi)**  
Pure Land Gardens boasting exquisite beauty throughout all four seasons.



**Hashino Iron Mine (Kamaishi)**  
It was listed as a World Heritage Site in July, 2015 as a site symbolizing the modernization of the steel industry in Japan.

### History and Culture



**Chagu Chagu Umako Festival (Takizawa, Morioka)**  
100 beautifully decorated horses are ridden by children about 15 km at a walking pace along the road. Held on the 2nd Saturday in June.



**Esashi Fujiwara no Sato Heritage Park (Oshu)**  
This part is a reconstruction of the buildings and streets of the Heian period. It is famous as a location for the filming of TV shows.



**Goshono Jomon Park (Ichinohe)**  
Ruins from the Jomon period dating back about 4,000 years cover the area.



**Morioka Castle Site Park (Iwate Park) (Morioka)**  
With cherry blossoms in the spring and fall colors in the autumn, this beautiful park is full of nature.



**Oni Kenbai (Demon's Sword Dance) (Kitakami)**



**Hayachine Kagura (Hanamaki)**  
Registered as a UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage in 2009.



**Shishi-Odori (Deer Dance) (Throughout Iwate)**

### Festivals



**1 January: Kokuseki-ji Sominsai (Oshu)**  
Kokuseki-ji, a Buddhist temple of the Tendai Sect of Mt. Myokensan, holds this festival of naked men and fire to ward off disaster and pray for an abundant harvest.



**2 April: Hitaka Hibuse Matsuri (Oshu)**  
9 musical hayashi-yatai floats decorated with luxurious ornaments move around town.



**3 April: Spring Fujiwara Festival (Hiraizumi)**  
Various events take place including Yoshitsune's Eastern Flight Processional and a parade of children in period costume.



**4 May: Esashi Jinku Festival (Oshu)**  
A festival celebrated by ten musical hayashi-yatai floats and 3,000 dancers.



**5 May: Gokusui no En (Hiraizumi)**  
Sake glasses float down the stream passing Mutsu-ji, and poets dressed in the garb of the Heian period read poetry.



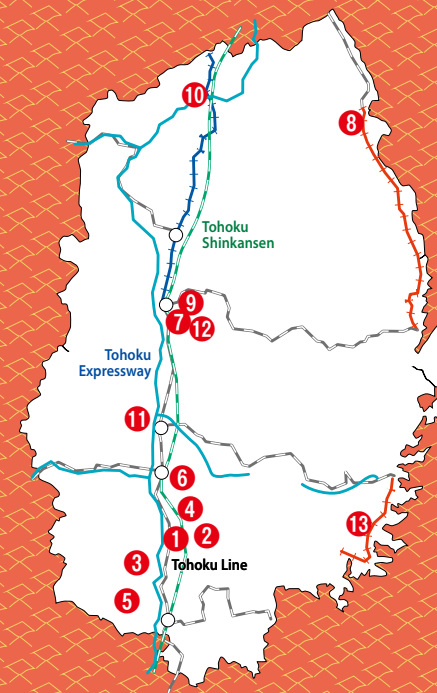
**6 August: Kitakami Michinoku Performing Arts Festival (Kitakami)**  
More than 100 groups of performers gather from all over Tohoku to give competing performances.



**7 August: Funekko Nagashi (Morioka)**  
Boats adorned with lanterns and other striking decorations float down the Nakatsugawa River wrapped in flame.



**8 September: Kuji Autumn Festival (Kuji)**  
Large, gorgeous floats and dynamic mikoshi pass down the main streets of the city.



**9 August: Sansa Odori (Morioka)**  
A vast parade of over 20,000 dancers, taiko drummers, and flute players. You can jump right in and join.



**10 September: Ninohe Matsuri (Ninohe)**  
A mikoshi leads a parade of 9 floats through the city.



**11 September: Hanamaki Matsuri (Hanamaki)**  
150 mikoshi and 10 splendid floats parade through the city.



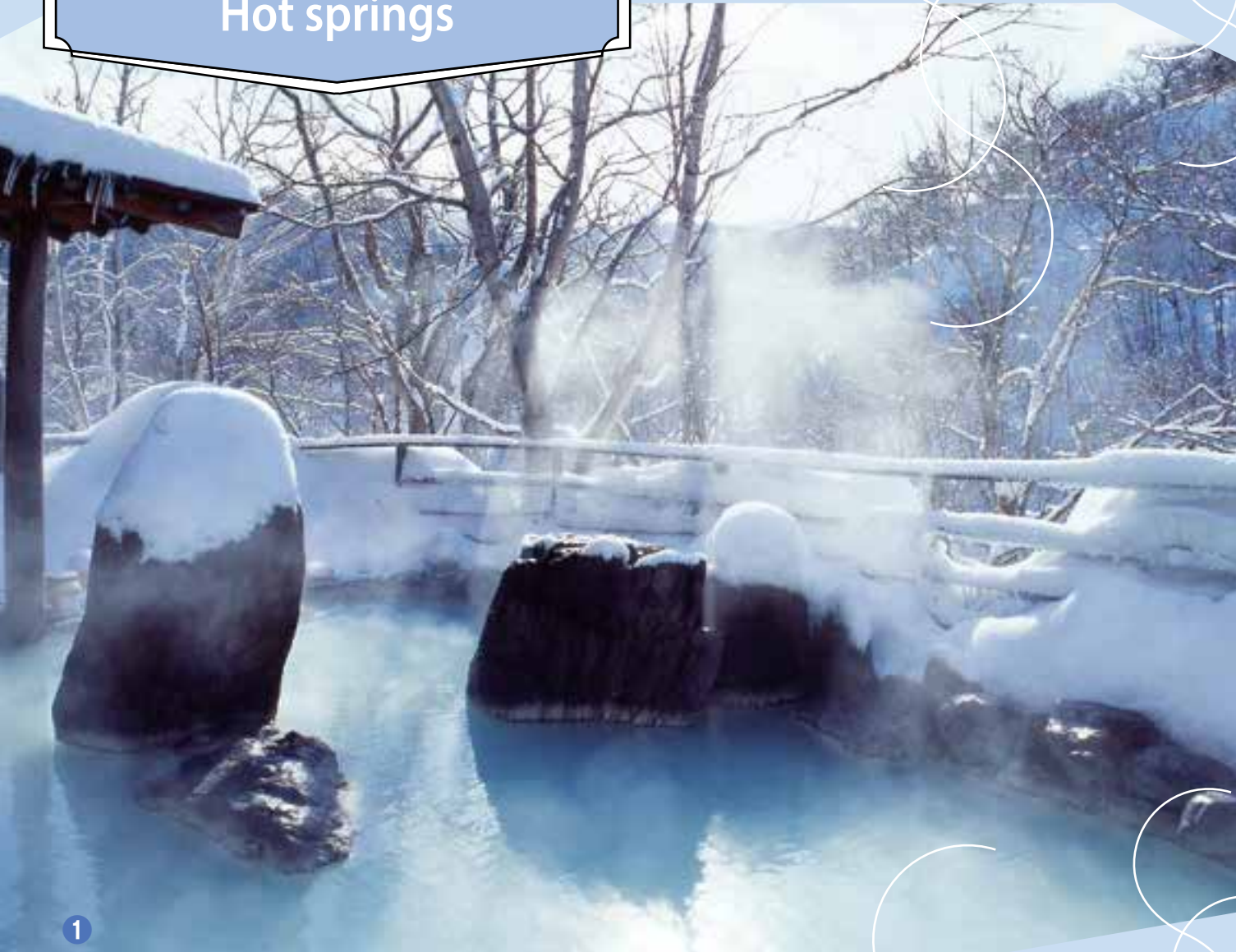
**12 September: Morioka Autumn Festival (Morioka)**  
With cries of "yaaare, yaaare," luxurious floats are pulled through the city.



**13 October: Kamaishi Matsuri (Kamaishi)**  
Boats carrying shinto gods travel on the ocean with toramai (tiger performance) and Shinto dancers on board.

15 mins by car from the Matsuo-Hachimantai IC

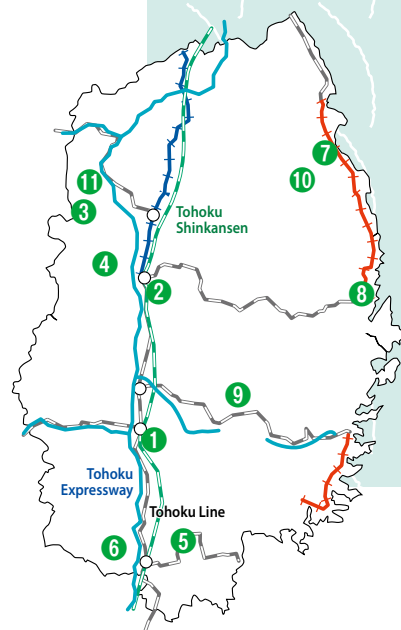

**Shower Climbing (Kuji)**  
Walk up a mountain stream with a guide.  
30 minutes by car from Kuji Station

**The Blue Cave / Sappa Boat Ride (Miyako)**  
\*Subject to the condition of the ocean.  
Operates every day from March to November

**Strawberry Picking (all Iwate)**  
Strawberry picking can be enjoyed all over Iwate from late December to June.

**Morioka Handi-Works Square (Morioka)**  
Visitors can try their hand at making various crafts, folk crafts, and foods or observe.  
10 mins by car from the Morioka IC



6

**Tono Furusato Village (Tono)**  
Traditional houses and *nambu magariya* from Iwate were relocated here and preserved in this experiential facility. Visitors can try their hand at various activities including making soba and mochi. 60 mins by car from the Towa IC / 20 mins by taxi from Tono Station



7

**Koiwai Farm (Shizukuishi)**  
Koiwai Farm is the largest private farm in Japan. At "Makiba-en," visitors can enjoy events and walks, meals, shopping, and more. The Iwate Snow Festival is an important part of winter in Iwate. Snow sculptures are lit up at night, allowing visitors to enjoy a different scene from during the day. 15 mins by car from the Morioka IC

**Miyazawa Kenji Memorial Museum (Hanamaki)**  
Learn about the life and works of the Hanamaki-born poet and author of children's stories. 15 mins by car from the Hanamaki-Minami IC.

**Hiking in Hachimantai (Hachimantai)**  
Lake Towada in Aomori was designated together with Hachimantai as the Towada Hachimantai National Park. It's a great place for hiking. 40 mins by car from the Matsuo-Hachimantai IC

**Kosode Coast (Kuji)**  
Known for the "Northernmost Ama Divers." There are must-see distinctive rock formations including Tsurigane Cave and Kabutoiwa Rock.

**Goishi Coast (Ofunato)**  
There are spectacular views from this scenic spot of various unique rock formations worn down over the years by the rough waves of the ocean.

**Unosu Cliffs (Tanohata)**  
A picturesque area of Sanriku with cliffs 200 meters tall stretching out along the coast.

**Takatamatsubara (Rikuzentakata)**  
Tens of thousands of pine trees that covered the beach were all destroyed by the tsunami but this one Miraculous Lone Pine Tree survived and became a symbol of post-disaster reconstruction.
